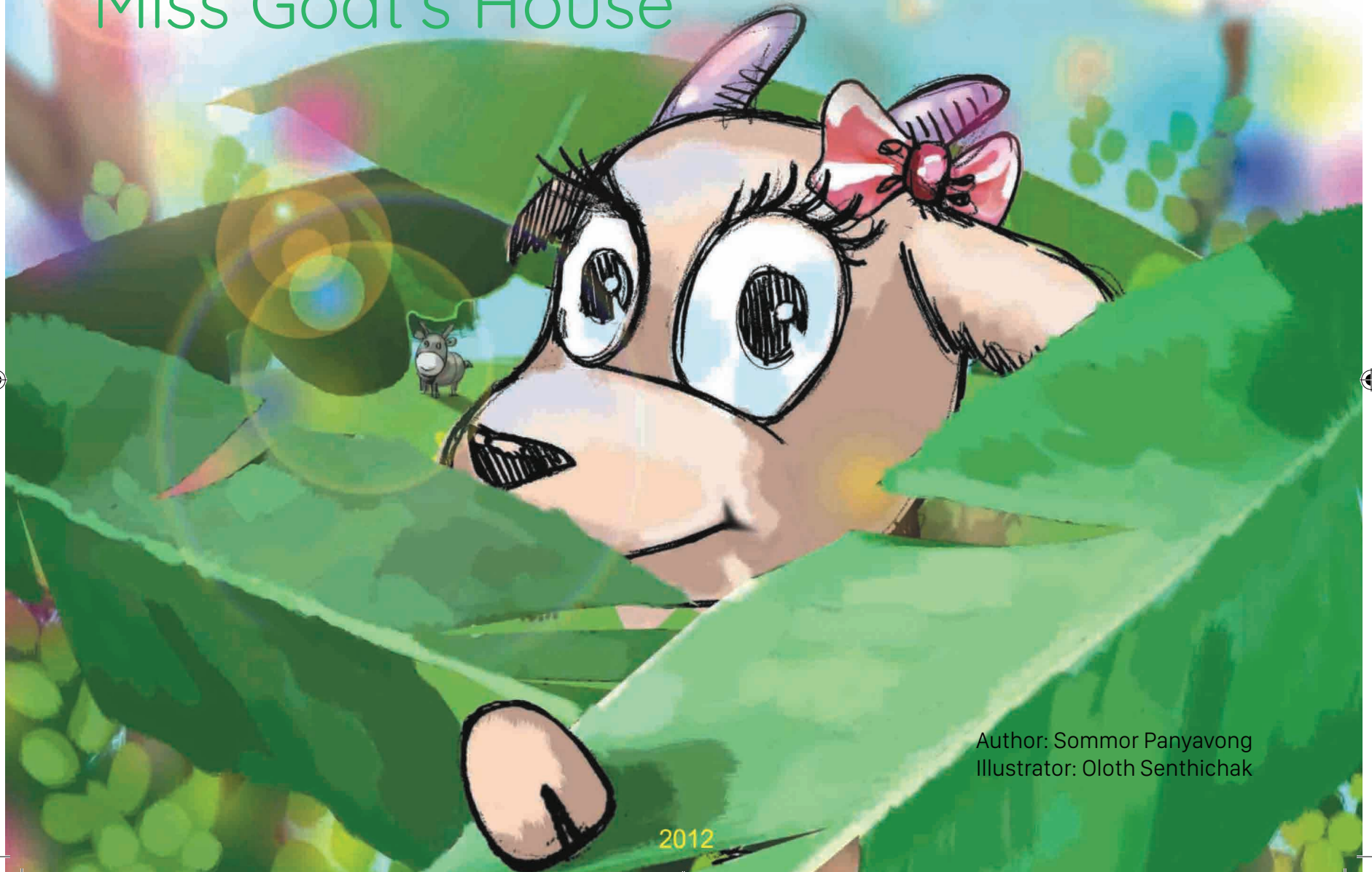




Miss Goat's House

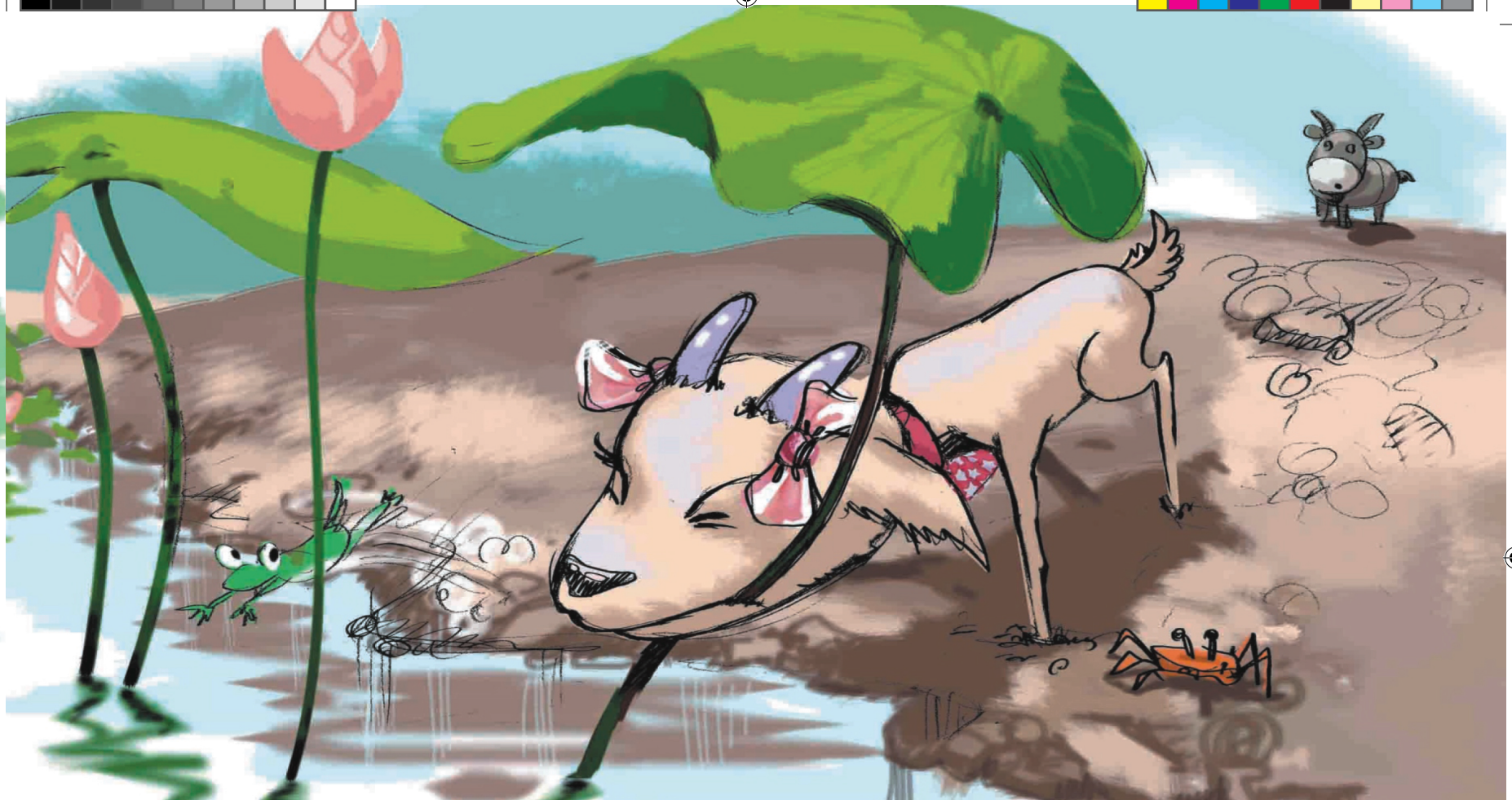

"I must make shelter to shade myself against the sun's rays", she says. So she cuts taro leaves to make a shelter.

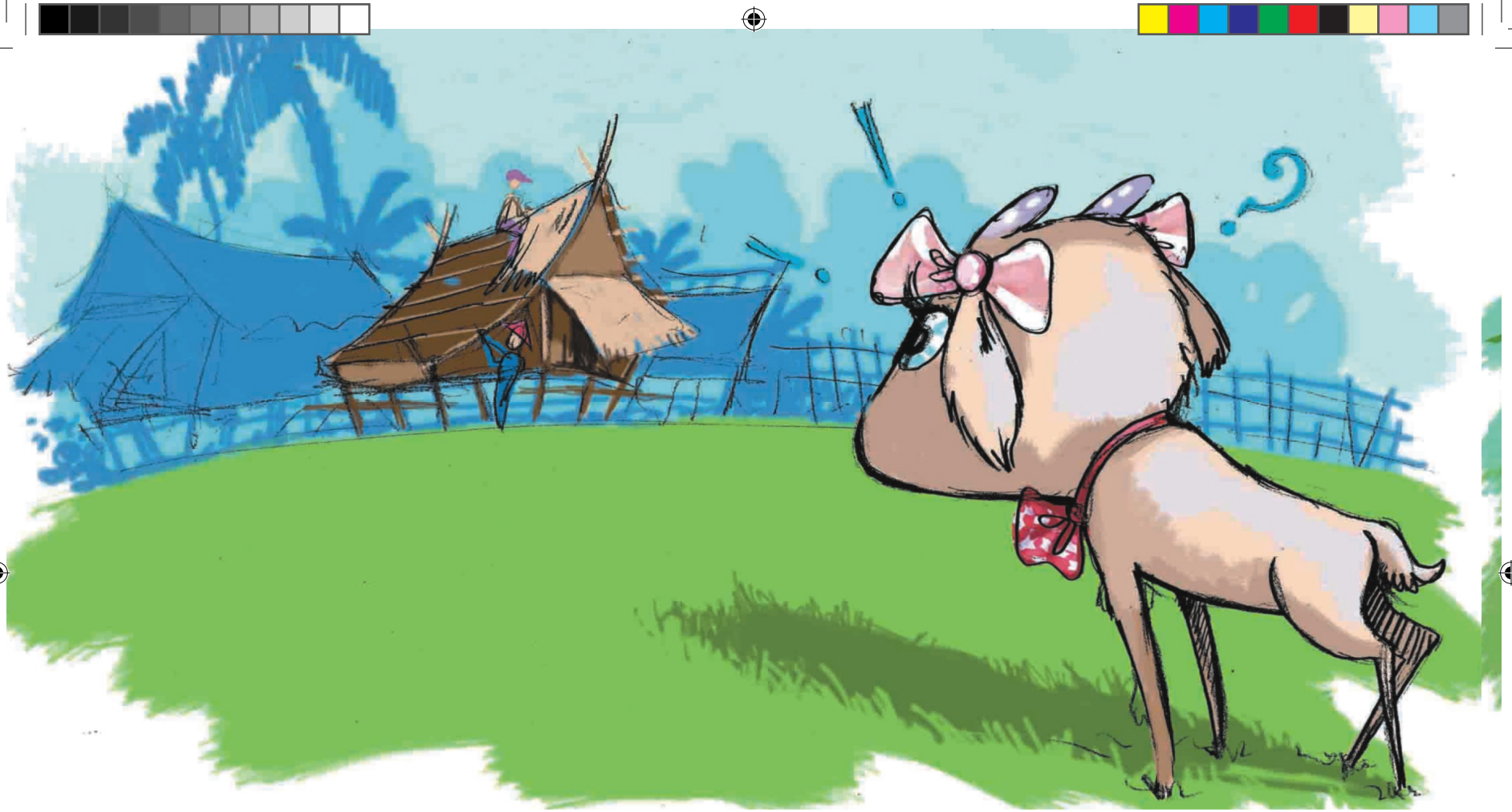
