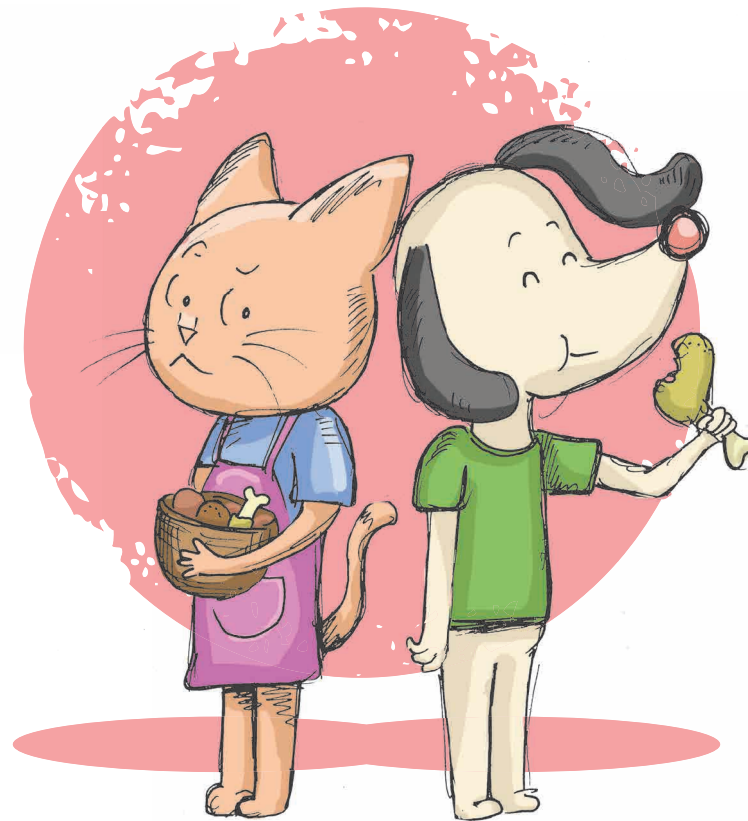




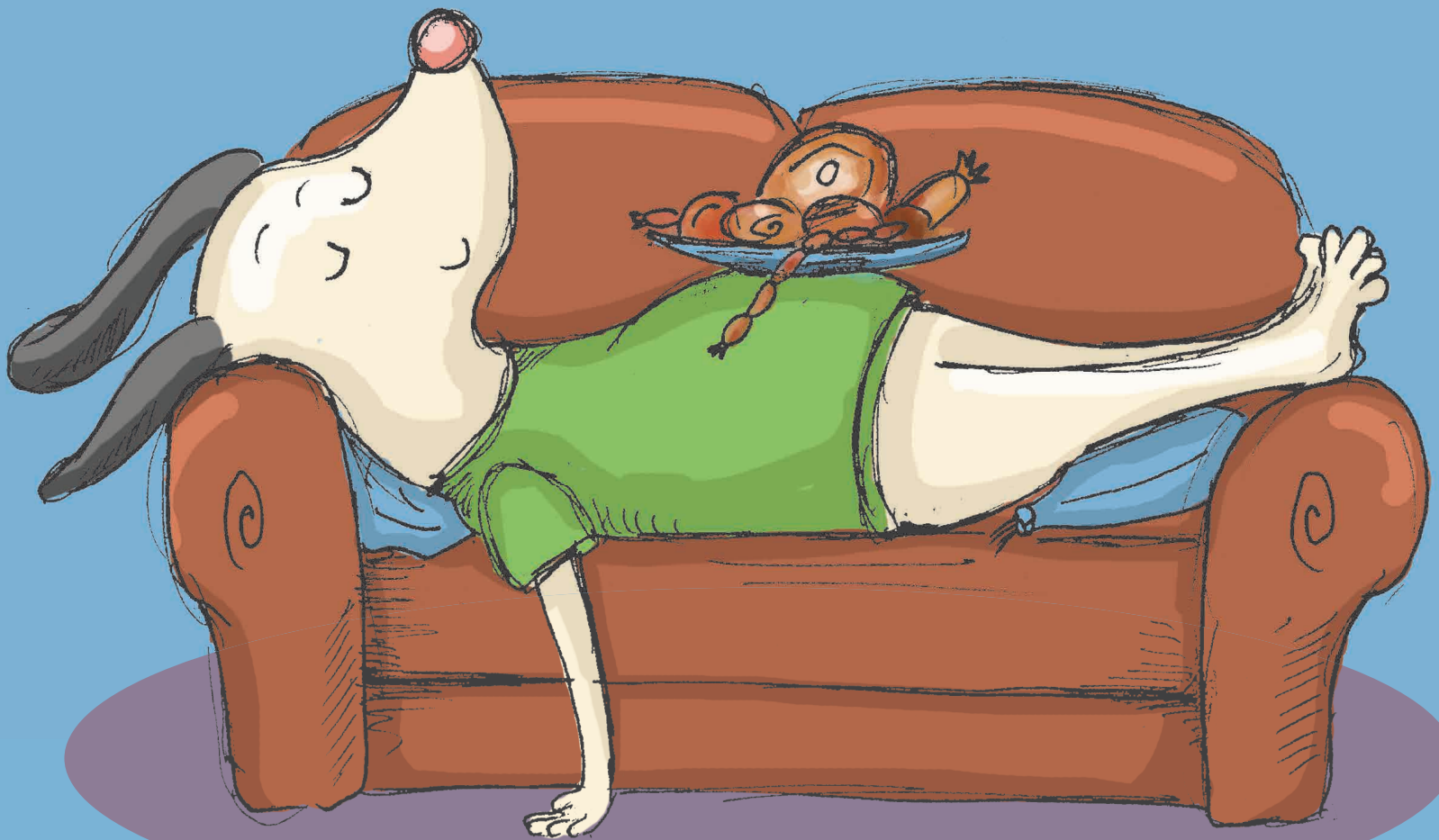
# The Greedy Dog

Dog loves to eat!



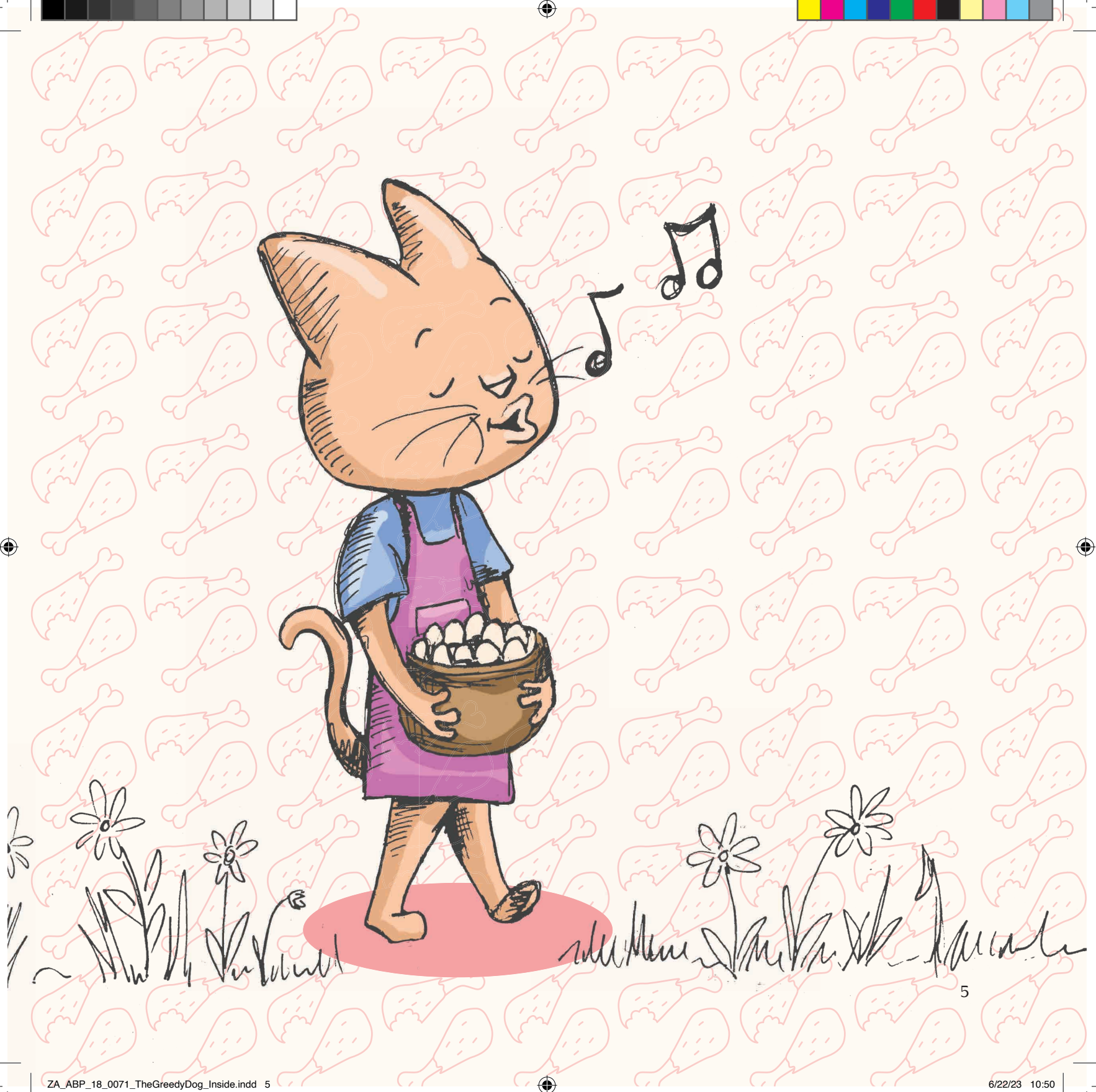




One day, Cat goes out to buy some eggs.

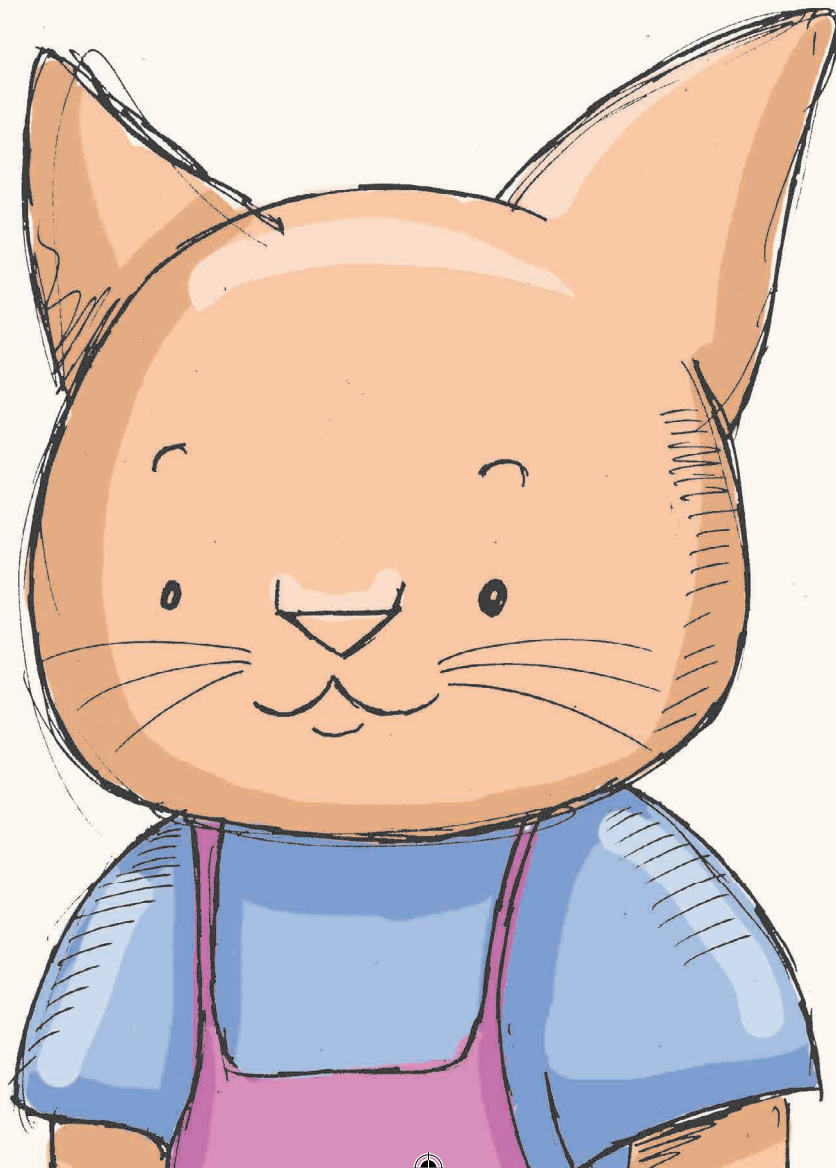








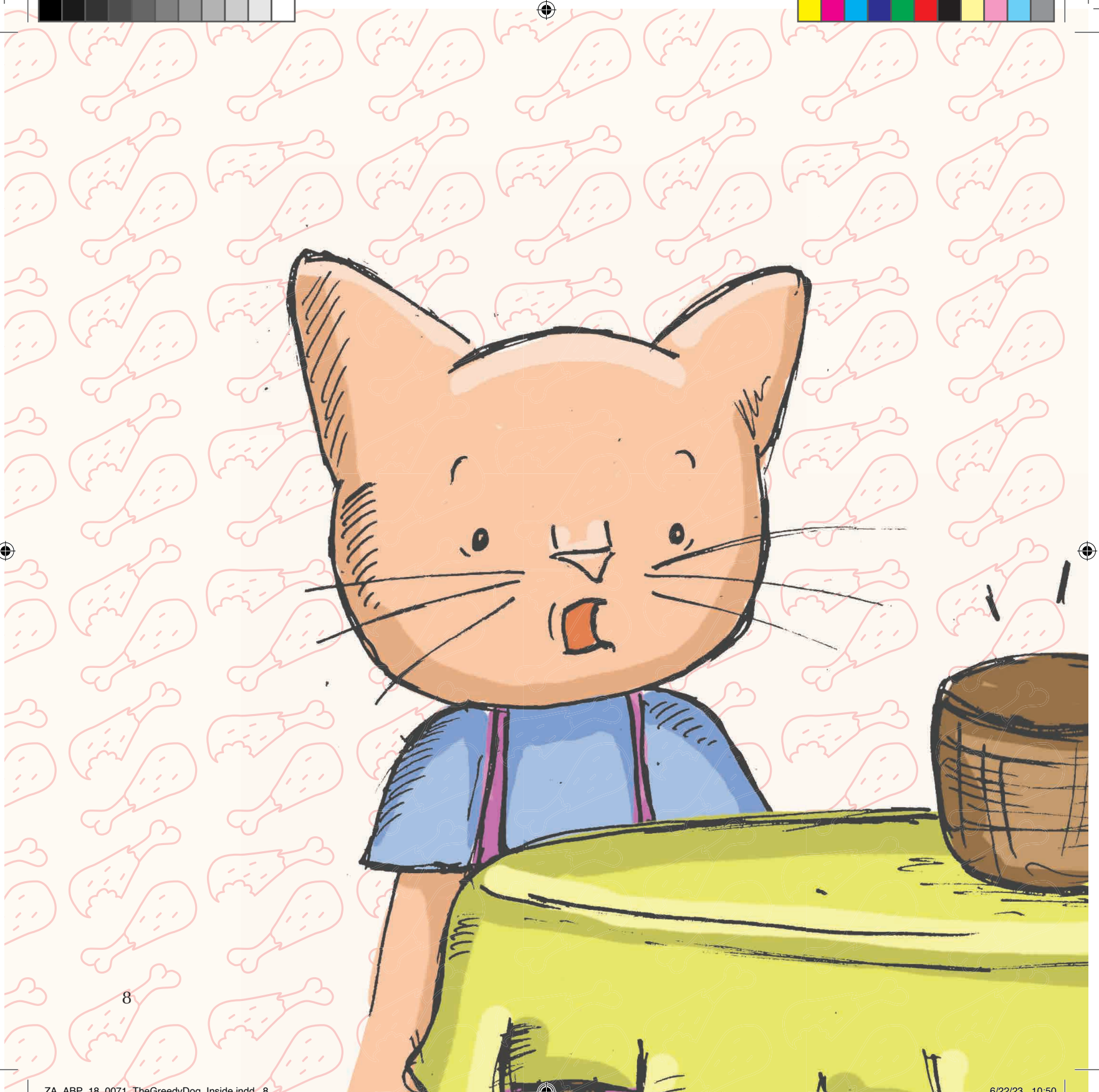
She comes back and puts them on the table.

grabs the bottle of milk.



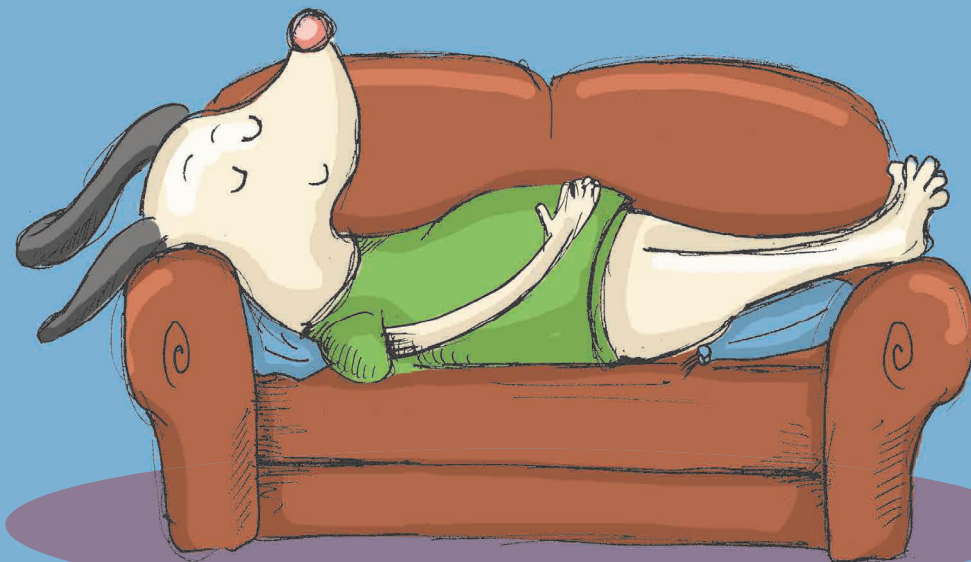
He pours it into a bowl,

on the couch.





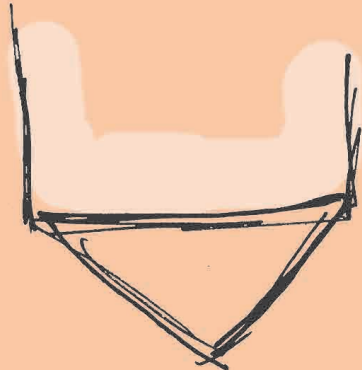
Cat goes into the kitchen.  
She sees the empty milk bottle.





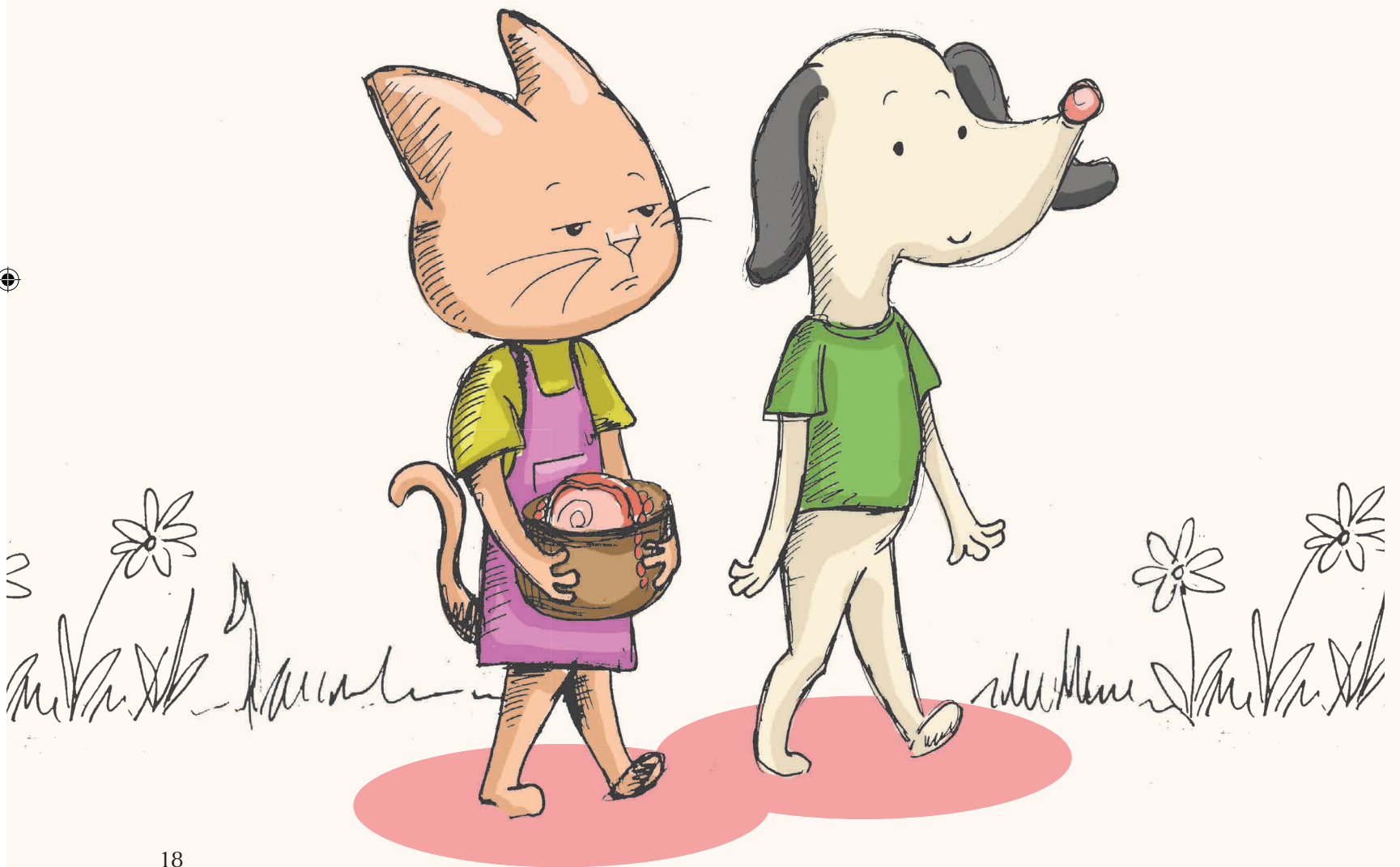


“You drank all my milk, you greedy dog!”  
Cat shouts.



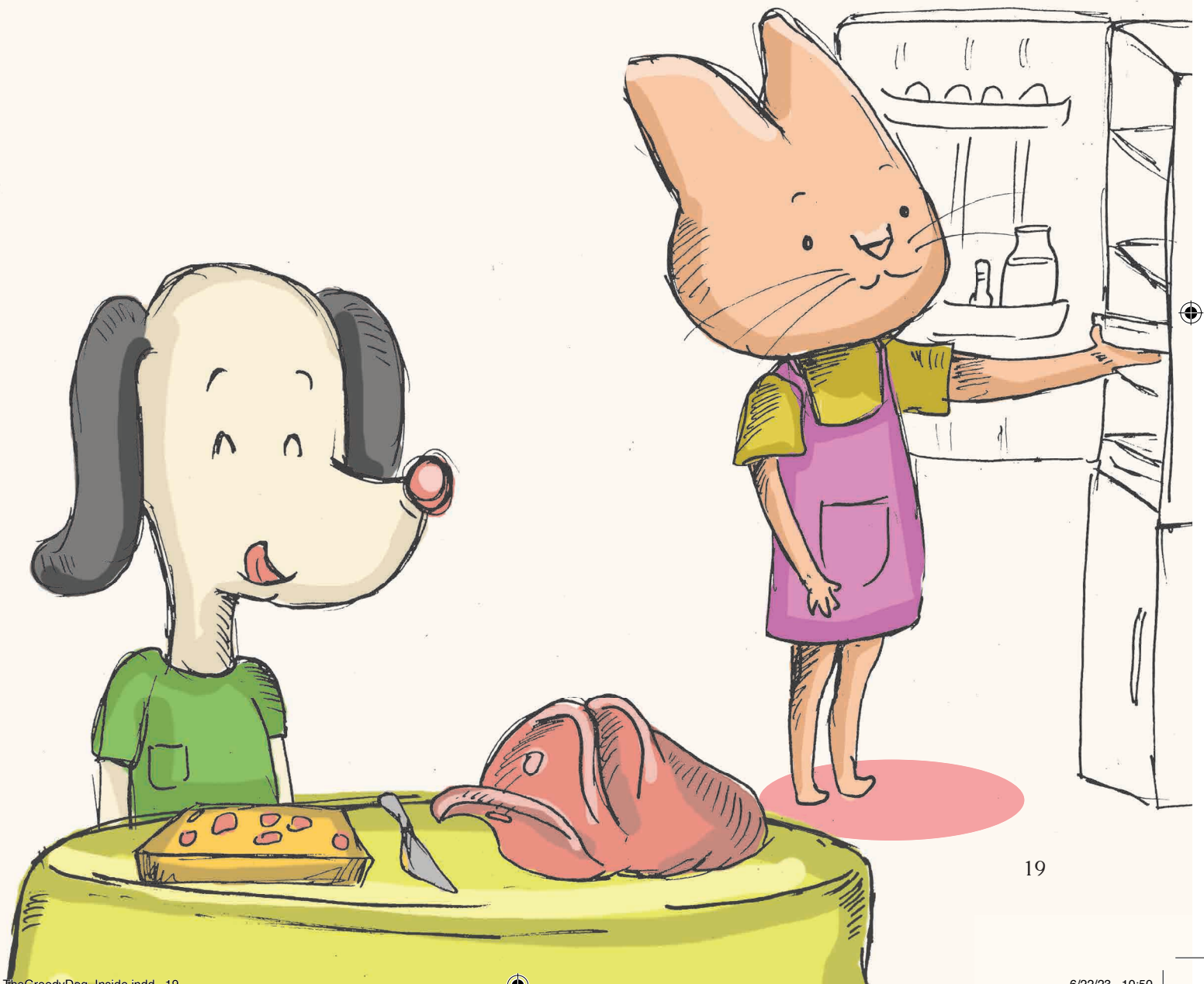


The next day, Cat and Dog go to the butchery to buy some meat.

glug



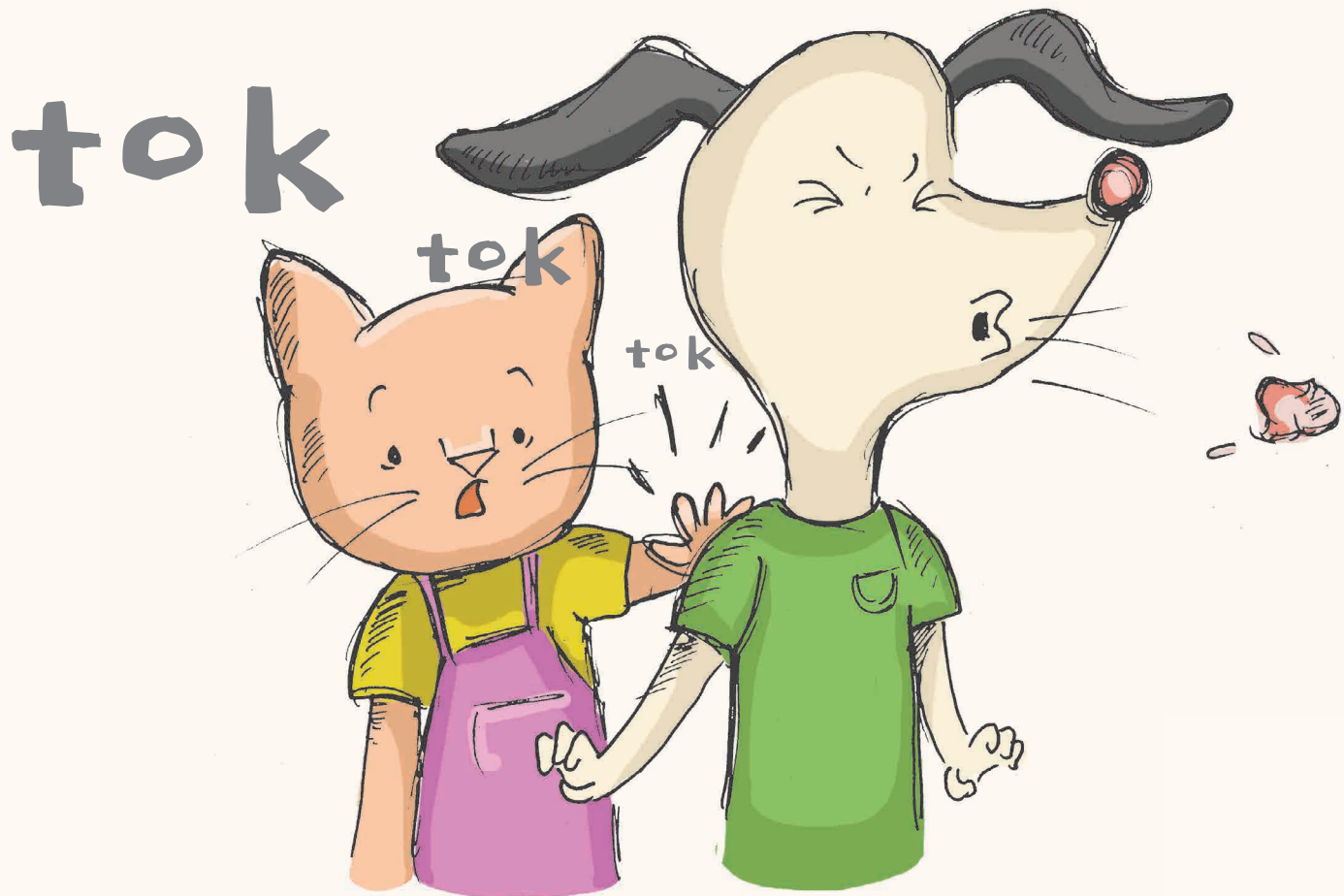
... but it gets **stuck** in his throat!

and Dog collapses on the floor.

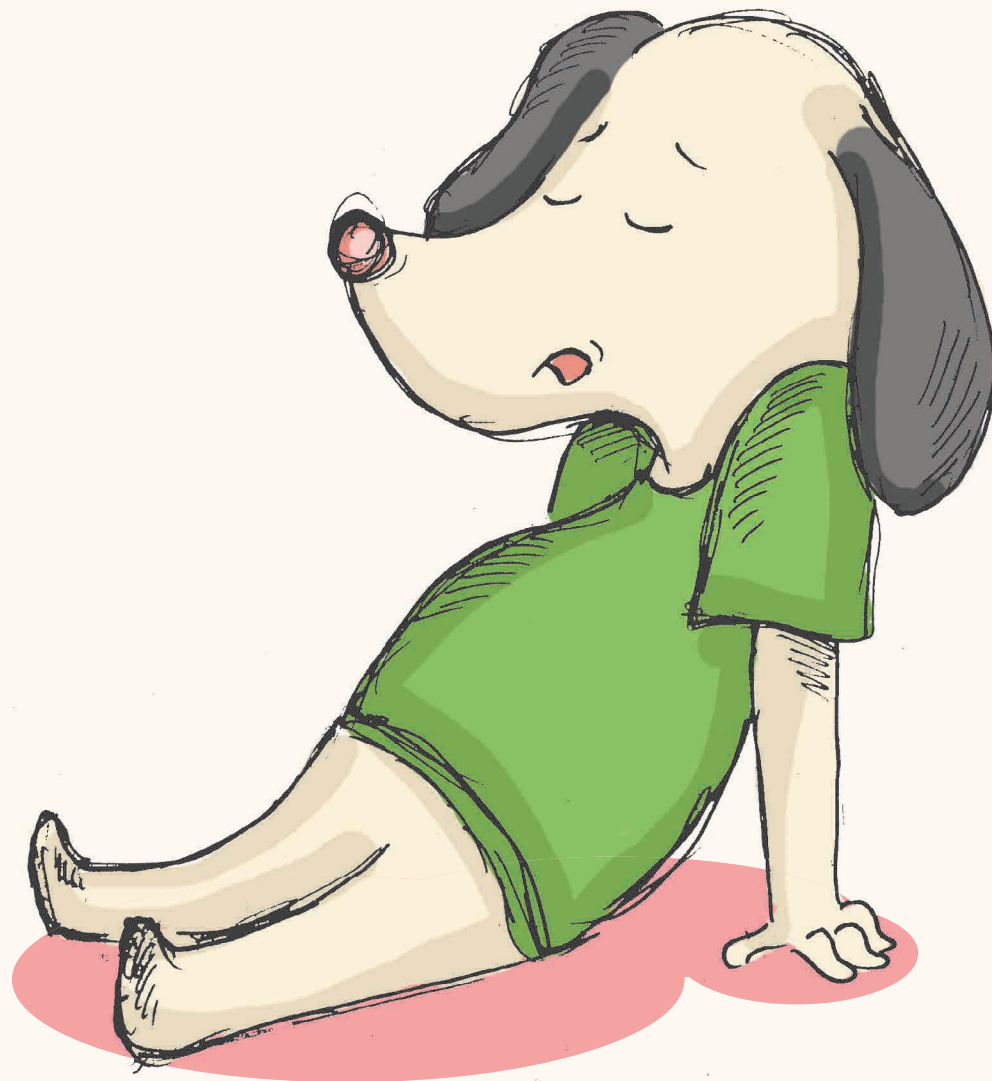
